

) Background

- 1 and 2 Kings were originally one book (on two scrolls) spanning over 380 years of history.
- The author is unknown. The original readers were Jews in captivity.
- Rather than focusing on a few key characters, 2 Kings tells the story of twenty-nine kings.
- During this period, Amos and Hosea prophesied in Israel, and Elisha, Obadiah, Joel, Isaiah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, and Jeremiah in Judah.
- Assyria takes the Northern Kingdom into captivity (722 BC) (17). Babylon takes Judah into captivity (586 BC) (25).
