Background

- We know little about Joel's life or background. His name means, "Jehovah is God."
- His prophecy focuses on the Southern Kingdom of Judah.
- Some believe he prophesied in middle 800's. Others believe he prophesied in late 500's. The book does not make the date clear.
- His message was prompted by a natural disaster of biblical proportions (1:1-12). It is only a foretaste of a much darker and more total day of judgment (2:1-11).

Landmark

The theme of Joel is "Preparing for the Day of the Lord." Joel uses a current calamity to teach God's people about the ruin of coming judgment, the depth of real repentance, and the hope of complete restoration.

60 Must See

- Christ is the God of mercy and kindness who blesses His covenant people (2:13-14)
- Christ is the coming Judge who will wage war against the rebellious nations (3:9-16).
- Christ is the God who will dwell among His people and bring peace and plenty to our world (3:18-21).
