Background

- Nahum was a prophet from the unknown town of Elkosh.
- Nahum is unique among the prophets because his message was written, not spoken.
- The book was written between 663BC 612 BC.
- At the time of Nahum's writing, Assyria was at the height of her power. She was the world's first superpower, known among the ancients as the cruelest of conquerors. Judah's kings were vassals of Assyria.
- This book is a pronouncement of judgment against Nineveh.
